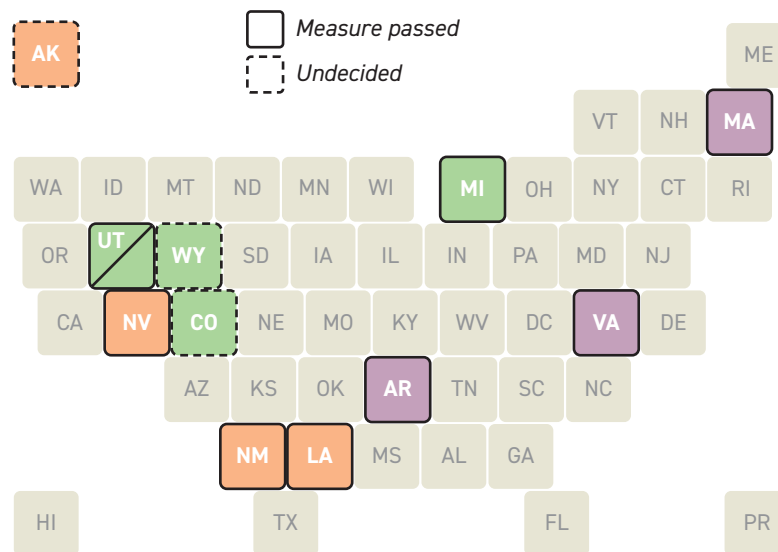
# Energy, environment, transportation and water

An Alaskan ballot measure that would increase taxes on high-producing North Slope oil reservoirs is on track to failing after meeting fierce resistance from the oil and gas industry. In Massachusetts, independent mechanics will gain vehicle data access, allowing them to compete with manufacturer repair shops.

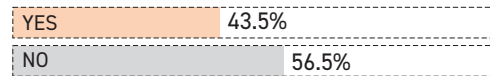

**ALASKA**

■ **Ballot Measure 1 initiative**

Increases oil and gas production taxes for certain fields, units and nonunitized reservoirs on the North Slope.

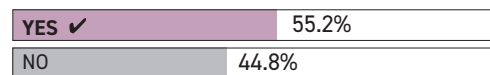

**ARKANSAS**

■ **Issue 1 legislative referendum**

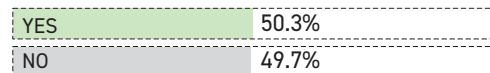
Continuation of a one-half percent sales tax on tangible personal property (except for food and food ingredients) to fund state's highways, roads and streets after the retirement of the bonds authorized by Amendment 91 of the Arkansas Constitution.



**COLORADO**

■ **Proposition 114 initiative**

Reintroduces gray wolves to public lands.

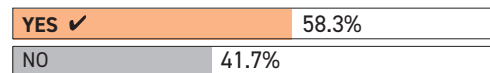

**LOUISIANA**

■ **Amendment 2 legislative referendum**

Amends state constitution regarding the valuation of oil and gas wells; authorizes inclusion of the presence and production of oil and gas in a well for the purpose of setting fair market value for ad valorem taxes.



**MICHIGAN**

■ **Proposal 1 legislative referendum**

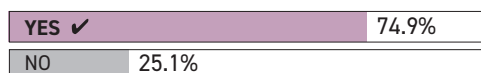
Amendment to the state constitution allows use of revenues from nonrenewable resource leases on state lands for the state natural resources trust fund and the state parks endowment fund.



**MASSACHUSETTS**

■ **Question 1 initiative**

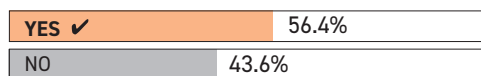
"Right to Repair" allows mechanics access to vehicle telematics data stored remotely.



**NEVADA**

■ **Question 6 initiative**

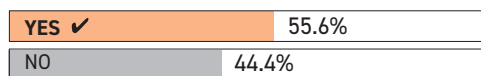
Doubles the Renewable Portfolio Standard from 25 percent by 2025 to 50 percent by 2030.



**NEW MEXICO**

■ **Amendment 1 legislative referendum**

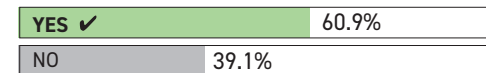
Public regulation commission shall consist of three members instead of five; nominated by the governor and chosen from a list submitted by the public regulation commission; commission to regulate public utilities and other public service companies as needed.



**UTAH**

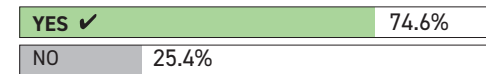
■ **Amendment D legislative referendum**

Revises a provision relating to municipal water rights and sources of water supply, eliminating references to municipal waterworks, and specifies the circumstances under which a municipality may commit water resources or supply water outside its boundary or exchange water resources.



■ **Amendment E legislative referendum**

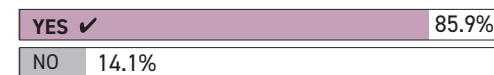
Creates a constitutional right to hunt and fish.



**VIRGINIA**

■ **Question 2 legislative referendum**

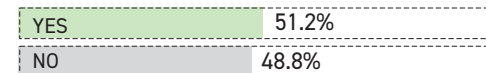
Exempts one vehicle from state and local property taxes for veterans who have a service-connected 100-percent permanent and total disability.



**WYOMING**

■ **Amendment A legislative referendum**

Removes the constitutionally specified limit on the amount of debt a municipality can create for sewer projects; allows state legislature to prescribe by law the debt limit for municipal sewer projects.
