## **E. LUCY BRAUN AWARD**



E. Lucy Braun was an eminent plant ecologist and the first woman president of the Ecological Society of America. Besides describing and mapping the deciduous forest regions of eastern North America, Lucy Braun served as a dedicated teacher and role model to her students. To honor her, this award is presented to a student for the outstanding poster presentation at the Society's Annual Meeting.

The 1994 winner of the E. Lucy Braun Award is Karen Kandl for her poster, "Inbreeding, family, and genotype affect environmental tolerance of mosquitofish," based on her current doctoral research at the University of Georgia under the supervision of Michael H. Smith. Karen received her bachelor's degree at Knox College, Galesburg, Illinois.

Receiving an honorable mention citation is Rebecca A. Young of the University of Tennessee for her poster, "The effect of spider presence on insect phytophagy in a garden test system."
