Becky J. Brown, Department of Botany, University of Florida, was the 1981 recipient of the Murray F. Buell Award.

Murray Buell ascribed great importance to the participation of students in meetings and to excellence in the presentation of papers.

To honor Murray F. Buell's dedication to the Ecological Society of America and to the younger generation of ecologists, this award is presented to a student (undergraduate, graduate or recent doctorate) for an outstanding paper presented at the Society's annual meeting.

The title of Becky Brown's paper, given at the annual meeting in Bloomington, Indiana, was: "Productivity and herbivory in high and low diversity tropical successional ecosystems."

The recipient of the Buell Award is selected by a group of judges composed of members of the Ecological Society of America, with John Kricher, Chairman.
