
DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CITATION

William Dwight Billings

William Dwight Billings, you are exemplary as a scholar, enormously productive in research, writing and teaching, and internationally recognized for this scholarship. Today we wish to recognize a different contribution: your service to the Ecological Society of America.

You served as Editor of *Ecology* for five years, from 1951 to 1956, and as Vice-president of the Ecological Society of America from 1959 to 1960. When Professor H. J. Oosting became ill in 1968 you served in an unofficial capacity as the Botanical Editor of *Ecological Monographs* for seven months, and continued another year officially as Editor. You concurrently served as Business Manager of the Society from 1968 to 1969, until a new Business Manager was appointed. More recently, from 1978 to 1979 you served as President of the Society. We will remember your tenure
