## Dalton Milford Brown 1898-1952

Dalton M. Brown, Professor and Head, Biology Department, East Tennessee State College, died at the Veteran's Administration Hospital, Mountain Home, Tennessee, on November 4, 1952.

Born at McMinnville, Tennessee, he graduated from the University of Tennessee with a B. S. in Agriculture in 1923, and received his M. S. in Education from that institution in 1926. He attended the University of Chicago and the University of Michigan, and in 1939 he received the Ph. D. degree from Duke University.

In 1926, after teaching for two years in the rural elementary schools and for two years in the high schools of Tennessee, Dr. Brown joined the staff

at East Tennessee State College. During his years at that institution, he organized and developed the Department of Biology and worked on the ecology of Roan Mountain.
